

The Chairman called the meeting to order at 1:45 P.M. and Senator Dirksen proceeded to read a statement on the subject of recent demonstrations, not only in Washington but around the Nation. It was stated that the statement would be presented as a joint one. Several suggestions were made as to how to improve it and the statement was approved.

Congressman Ford spoke of a meeting at the White House the previous evening on the anti-war rally. He said he would endeavor to obtain a copy of a statement the President read which gave factual background information and which the President said had been released.
