









Dear Mr. Ambassador:

Illinois is a leading exporter of agricultural and industrial products. We understand the need for free and open trade among nations.

In some areas, however, our free trade is one-sided. We in the United States have opened our markets only to find ourselves competing with imports that are subsidized in nonobvious ways. Such an area of concern is the current negotiations with the Japanese for continuation of their voluntary auto export restraints.

It is our hope that during these negotiations, you will keep these hidden subsidies in mind and use your influence to see that the United States auto industry with its hundreds of thousands of jobs is protected from unfair competition.
