1848	National Guard (1957). Efforts to revitalize the National Guard and to modify its training procedures.
1849-1851	National Home Ownership Foundation (1967-68). Legislation to charter the Foundation to encourage the private sector to provide housing.
1852	National Insurance Development Corporation (1969). Statement of the Corporation's history and purpose.
1853	National Inventory Commission ¹⁹⁴⁵ (1968). Proposals to establish a central publishing agency in the government ^{commission.}
1854	National Labor Relations Act (1957). Periodical article about the United Auto Workers boycott of the Kohler Company.
1855-1858	National Labor Relations Board (1965-68). Legislation to remedy complaints about the Board's operation; study of the Board's role and history; individual cases involving the Board; Dirksen bill to settle airline labor dispute (1966).
1859-1870	National Labor Relations Board. Orchestra Leaders and Musicians (1965-66). Correspondence with musicians and the American Federation of Musicians regarding the latter's jurisdiction over its members, the status of the union under anti-trust law, and whether or not orchestra leaders should be considered employees.
1871	National Lawyers Guild (1950). Report on the Guild from the House Committee on Un-American Activities.
1872	National Old Line Insurance Company (1956). Information regarding a Securities and Exchange Commission investigation into stock manipulation.
1873-1875	National Parks. Employment (1964-66). Applications and correspondence regarding summer jobs with the National Park Service.
1876	National Park Service Expansion (1969). Secretary of the Interior Walter Hickel's pledge to expand the park area in the eastern U.S.
1877	National UNICEF Day (1967). Legislation to designate October 31 of each year as National UNICEF Day.
1878-1881	Natural Gas Act (1954-58). Information and correspondence about natural gas production, distribution, and rate structure.
1882	Natural Resources (1966). "Natural Beauty and the Administration of Natural Resource," by Hugo Fisher, Administrator of the Resources Agency of California.
1883	Navy (1958). Information about naval vessels, chiefly the <u>USS Forrestal</u> , and the Sixth Fleet.

1884	Near East (1959). A report for the Senate Foreign Relations Committee prepared by the Institute for Mediterranean Affairs entitled "United States Foreign Policy in the Near East."
1885	Negros (1956). An open letter from 101 Negro ministers printed in the Chicago <u>Daily Tribune</u> supporting Eisenhower's re-election.
1886-1889	Newspapers (1967-69). Legislation known as the "Failing Newspaper Act" to grant a limited exemption from anti-trust laws to newspapers involved in joint arrangements or combinations. Proposal grew out of a situation involving a Justice Department suit against Tucson Newspapers, Inc.
1890	News-Sun Broadcasting Company (Waukegan, Illinois) (1963). Company's application for FM broadcasting facilities.
1891-1895	Nixon, Richard M. (1958, 1968-69). 1958 Nixon interview; clippings concerning 1968 campaign, selection of Cabinet, and first months in office; Dirksen's list of suggestions for the Cabinet.
1896-1899	Nominations (1931, 1952-53, 1959, 1969). Federal Power Commission nominees, 1931; list of all civilian nominations submitted to the Senate during 1952; hearings on nominees for positions in armed forces, 1953; Dirksen nominations to independent agencies, 1959; Nixon nominations.
1900	Norman, E. Herbert (1957). Pamphlet and <u>Congressional Record</u> excerpt regarding Norman who was Canadian Ambassador to Egypt and who committed suicide in 1957 after the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee alleged he had communist connections.
1901	North American Airlines (1955). Information regarding the company's violation of the Civil Aeronautics Act.
1902	North Atlantic Treaty Organization (1958, 1966). Dirksen's report on his participation in the 1958 NATO Parliamentarian's Conference; status of NATO in 1966 upon France's withdrawal.
1903	North Central Airlines (1957). Memorandum supporting absorption of Lake Central Airlines by North Central.
1904-1905	Northwest Airlines, Inc. (1954-55, 1957). Information concerning Northwest's competition with Pan American Airways for Pacific routes.
1906	Northwestern University (1967). Legislation to provide for free entry of a triaxial apparatus and rheogoniometer for the University's use.
1907	Nursing Homes (1966). Information regarding the impact of the Medicare program upon nursing homes.
1908	Nutrition and Human Needs Select Committee (1968). Proposal to create the Committee.
