1909	Oak Ridge, Tennessee (1953). <u>Congressional Record</u> excerpt discussing the atomic energy program.
1910-1922	Obscenity Legislation (1963-69). Legislative Reference Service studies of obscenity law and censorship of obscene materials; correspondence regarding legislation restricting the distribution of obscene materials. Dirksen introduced bills to prohibit the use of interstate facilities for transportation of salacious advertising and to limit judicial review of obscenity cases.
1923-1924	Occupational Safety and Health Act (1968). Legislation, committee reports, and related information about the Act.
1925-1934	Office of Economic Opportunity (1964-69). Correspondence, <u>Congressional Record</u> excerpts, memoranda, bills and reports, and reference information concerning the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964 and subsequent amendments, programs and spending of the Office, the War on Poverty, and the Community Action Program. Includes reports from the Republican National Committee and the Senate Republican Policy Committee.
1935-1937	Office of Federal Contract Compliance (1969). Copies of correspondence and reference information concerning the Nixon administration's "Philadelphia Plan" to require government contractors to establish quotas for minorities to receive federal contracts.
1938-1956	Oil and Gas Monopoly (1948, 1955-59). Correspondence, Congressional bills and reports, and reference information dealing with the problems of international petroleum production, distribution, and pricing. Includes copies of correspondence among the Office of Defense Mobilization, the Interior Department, the Attorney General, and Senator Joseph O'Mahoney regarding the Middle East crisis and oil flow through the Suez Canal. File also contains information about antitrust matters, including authorization of a "Voluntary Agreement" allowing oil producers, immune from antitrust laws, to join together to ensure the oil flow. The implication of forming this monopoly is the subject of 1957 testimony before the Antitrust and Monopoly Subcommittee following the stoppage of the Suez Canal and the I.P.C. pipeline. There is also information about the proposed American pipeline from the U.S. Gulf Coast to the East Coast.
1956a	<i>Oil Import Controls (1969). Activities of task force on controls.</i>
1957	Oil Reserves (1967). Dale H. Flagg, "Our Low Oil Reserves Threaten: Are We Poor in the Midst of Plenty?"
1958-1961	Olives (1965-69). Information about efforts by the olive industry to reform the tariff on green olive imports. Dirksen introduced legislation to investigate the importation of olives.
1962-1964	Olmstead, George (1969). Olmstead was chairman and president of the International Bank, Washington, D.C., which had claims against the Dominican Republic related to timber cutting and milling operations.

1965	Olympic Games (1959). Letter from the U.S. Olympic Committee regarding the admission of Red China to the Olympic Games.
1966	One-Bank Holding Firms (1969). Correspondence, clippings, and memoranda about legislation to bring holding firms under federal regulation.
1967-1968	Organization of American States (1969). Contains a position paper, "United States Policy on Management of the OAS," outlining proposed changes in the operation of the organization.
1969	Organization of Congress (1966). Report of the Joint Committee on the Organization of Congress.
1970	Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (1968-69). Clippings.
1971-1972	Oscar Mayer Company (1967-68). Information, correspondence, and memoranda about legislation, which the Company sought, to amend the Internal Revenue Code to defer from U.S. taxation certain income of foreign personal holding companies reinvested in qualified investments in less developed countries.
1973-1978	Otepka, Otto (1966-67, 1969). 1966 hearings on Otepka's dismissal as security evaluator for the State Department for allegedly leaking classified information; copy of a 1967 letter from Dean Rusk reprimanding Otepka; 1969 nomination of Otepka to serve on the Subversive Activities Control Board; press criticism of the nomination and memoranda from Otepka refuting charges; hearings on the nomination.
1979	Pabst Brewing Company (1952). Clippings regarding a delayed Justice Department prosecution of the Company for use of unsanitary grain.
1980	Pacific Far East Line of San Francisco (1957). Clippings about the rivalry between the Pacific Line and the Matson Navigation Company for Hawaiian shipping rights.
1981-1982	Packers and Stockyards Act (1957). Legislation to amend the anti-trust laws to prevent unlawful restraints in commerce and monopolistic acts by persons engaged in the commerce of meat products. Includes Dirksen's handwritten 6-page outline of the history of the Act.
1983	Panama Canal (1967). Remarks by Dirksen and others regarding a proposed new treaty.
1984-1985	Pan-American Games (1958-59). Legislative request for an appropriation to defray in part the cost of the Pan American games in Chicago.
1986	Paralyzed Veterans of America (1967, 1969). Legislation to incorporate the Paralyzed Veterans of America.
1987	Pardons (1967). Memorandum regarding the remission of fines following Presidential pardons.
