1966	One-Bank Holding Firms (1969). Correspondence, clippings, and memoranda about legislation to bring holding firms under federal regulation.
1967-1968	Organization of American States (1969). Contains a position paper, "United States Policy on Management of the OAS," outlining proposed changes in the operation of the organization.
1969	Organization of Congress (1966). Report of the Joint Committee on the Organization of Congress.
1970	Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (1968-69). Clippings.
1971-1972	Oscar Mayer Company (1967-68). Information, correspondence, and memoranda about legislation, which the Company sought, to amend the Internal Revenue Code to defer from U.S. taxation certain income of foreign personal holding companies reinvested in qualified investments in less developed countries.
1973-1978	Otepka, Otto (1966-67, 1969). 1966 hearings on Otepka's dismissal as security evaluator for the State Department for allegedly leaking classified information; copy of a 1967 letter from Dean Rusk reprimanding Otepka; 1969 nomination of Otepka to serve on the Subversive Activities Control Board; press criticism of the nomination and memoranda from Otepka refuting charges; hearings on the nomination.
1979	Pabst Brewing Company (1952). Clippings regarding a delayed Justice Department prosecution of the Company for use of unsanitary grain.
1980	Pacific Far East Line of San Francisco (1957). Clippings about the rivalry between the Pacific Line and the Matson Navigation Company for Hawaiian shipping rights.
1981-1982	Packers and Stockyards Act (1957). Legislation to amend the anti-trust laws to prevent unlawful restraints in commerce and monopolistic acts by persons engaged in the commerce of meat products. Includes Dirksen's handwritten 6-page outline of the history of the Act.
1983	Panama Canal (1967). Remarks by Dirksen and others regarding a proposed new treaty.
1984-1985	Pan-American Games (1958-59). Legislative request for an appropriation to defray in part the cost of the Pan American games in Chicago.
1986	Paralyzed Veterans of America (1967, 1969). Legislation to incorporate the Paralyzed Veterans of America.
1987	Pardons (1967). Memorandum regarding the remission of fines following Presidential pardons.

1989-1998	Patent Legislation (1956, 1965-69). Information about international competition in patents and patent revision (1956); American Bar Association recommendations for legislation (1965); general patent revision bills coming to the Senate subcommittee on Patents, Trademarks, and Copyrights.
1999-2000	Patrick Warren Construction Company (1950-52). The Company was plaintiff against the U.S. in a suit to receive reimbursement for losses incurred to complete building for the Veterans Administration.
2001-2002	Pay As You Go Television (1957-58). Information regarding the benefits and drawbacks of pay T.V.
2003	Payroll Deduction (1967). Payroll deduction and equal employment opportunity guidelines.
2004-2006	Peanuts (1950-51, 1954). Legislation affecting peanut marketing quota provisions and acreage allotments.
2007-2011	Pension Plans (1957-59, 1966-68). 1957 Dirksen bill to establish voluntary pension plans by individuals and subsequent correspondence; tax treatment of voluntary retirement plans; federal employees retirement and benefits program; corporate pension funds and other private retirement programs; Welfare and Pension Plan Protection Act of 1967; Pension Plan Security Act of 1968; differentiation in sex and age in retirement plans.
2012	Peoples Gas Company (1951). Proposal concerning the use of eminent domain in connection with the transportation, distribution, or storage of gas, and granting rights for gas shortage in Illinois.
2013	Photography Week (1967-68). Legislation to designate Photography Week.
2014	Poland (1956, 1961-62). Tributes in commemoration of anniversaries of Poland's adoption of the 1791 Constitution.
2015-2025	Politics (1948-59). Political pamphlets and reference information concerning Republican and Democratic principles and various public issues, including foreign policy and the United Nations. Clippings from the 1956 and 1958 campaigns are included as well as Republican Policy Committee studies of the Yalta Papers, taxation, and communist influences and corruption in Democratic administrations.
2026-2042	Pollution Legislation (1962, 1965-69). Legislation, committee reports, memoranda, and reference material relating to water and air pollution. Bulk deals with amendments to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act. Other topics: Chicago area pollution, Lake Michigan pollution, tax credits for a pollution control, the Oil Pollution Act, and the Clean Air Act.

2044-2054	Postal Legislation (1955, 1957-58, 1960, 1968-69). Information about postal rates, civil service reform, wages for postal employees, appropriatio and postal reform. Includes Dirksen's handwritten notes on the conference committee report for the 1960 postal rates bill.
2055-2057	Potash (1969). Correspondence regarding application of the Anti-dumping Act to importation of Canadian potash.
2058-2061	Poverty (1967-68). Correspondence and reference information about federal poverty programs, including activities of the Office of Economic Opportunity and the Agriculture Department's food distribution program.
2062	Powell, Adam Clayton (1966-69). Clippings, <u>Congressional Record</u> excerpts, and proceedings in Powell's suit against John W. McCormack, <u>et al.</u>
2063	Power Projects (1958). Analysis of a bill to provide for the joint development of the water power resources of the Trinity River division, Central Valley project, California.
(2064-2166)	Prayer Amendment (1938, 1959, 1962-69). The Prayer Amendment file contains clippings, correspondence, hearings, reference information, statements, and legislation regarding Dirksen's efforts to secure a Constitutional amendment permitting voluntary prayer in public buildings, including schools. A chronology of Dirksen's efforts follows: March 1966, Dirksen introduced S.J.Res. 148. August 1966, hearings were held on the proposal. September 1966, Dirksen failed in his effort to substitute S.J.Res. 14 for the UNICEF resolution. January 1967, Dirksen introduced S.J.Res. 1. July 1968, Dirksen unsuccessfully attempted to substitute his prayer amendment for the Bible Translation Day amendment. January 1969, Dirksen re-introduced the amendment as S.J.Res. 6.
2064-2066	Prayer Amendment. Burch, Francis B., Correspondence (1966). Letters from the National Chairman of the Constitution Prayer Foundation enclosing 1965 statements from U.S. Senators on the prayer amendment. Includes a list indicating the position of Congressmen and Senators on the bill.
2067-2070	Prayer Amendment. Clippings (1962, 1966-69). Press coverage of Dirksen's efforts to secure a constitutional amendment to permit voluntary prayer in public schools. Other topics: National Council of Churches, Supreme Court rulings on prayer, an Illinois bill to allow a period of "silent reflection" in public schools.

2151-2166	Prayer Amendment. Statements and Bills (1965-69). Memoranda, draft resolutions, Dirksen's remarks, <u>Congressional Record</u> excerpts, vote tallies, correspondence with Senators, and legislation pertaining to the prayer amendment. Includes a 1966 Legislative Reference Service compilation of Senate and House prayer bills, 1963-65.
2167	Prefabricated Door Boycott Case (1967). Supreme Court decision upholding a union boycott of prefabricated doors.
2168	Pre-Merger Notification (1957-58). Antitrust legislation; mining exemption in pre-merger notification bill.
2169	Presidential Campaign (1966, 1968). Presidential Election Campaign Fund; bill to suspend equal time requirements for campaign broadcasts.
2170-2174	Presidential Disability and Succession (1957-58, 1962, 1965). Proposed legislation in the wake of Dwight Eisenhower's illness; subsequent proposal relating to Presidential succession.
2175	Presidential Election (1967). Proposal to amend the Constitution and reform the Electoral College.
2176-2182	Presidential Messages (1958-59, 1964). Copies of selected remarks by the President on many topics. Includes certain State of the Union messages and Dirksen's reaction to them.
2183	Presidential Protection (1967). Legislation authorizing additional Secret Service protection.
2184	Presidential Qualifications (1968). Legislative Reference Service studies of George W. Romney's eligibility for the Presidency.

2201	Puerto Rico (1959). Excerpts from a speech delivered by the floor leader and state chairman of the Republican Party of Puerto Rico.
2202	Quaker Oats Company (1967-68). Correspondence with the Company regarding a foreign tax credit carryback claim.
2203	Questionnaires ^{1954-69.} (1959). Dirksen's response to questions about socialism and capitalism, wage-price controls, international rivalries, and foreign economic competition, <i>political parties, and several legislative issues.</i>
2204	Radford, Arthur (1958). Legislation regarding Radford's retirement.
2205-2208	Railroad File (1957-58). Hearings before the Surface Transportation Subcommittee on the railroad industry; the Transportation Act of 1958; railroad freight rates.
