2617	Strike Legislation (1969). Remarks on strikes and labor activities; draft of legislation to prevent strikes in industries affecting commerce.
2618	Student Disorders (1968-69). Memoranda on the Constitutional effects of limiting federal prosecution to cases which states have failed to prosecute; legislation authorizing the Judiciary Committee to investigate student disorders.
2619-2632	Sugar (1960, 1962, 1964-66). Hearings and memoranda concerning 1960 and 1965 amendments to the Sugar Act of 1948. Specific topics: sugar prices and markets; domestic sugar production; and sugar industry proposals. A memorandum explaining the impact of the sugar issue on the 1960 Presidential election is included.

2633	Supersonic Transport Plane (1969). Memorandum regarding legislation to create a quasi-public Corporation to finance construction of the plane.

Correspondence about S. 2646 (Jenner Bill, 1958) to limit the appellate jurisdiction of the Supreme Court in certain cases, including the Justice Department's position; information, including Dirksen typed outlines, about a 1959 joint resolution to create a commission to study the role and function of the Supreme Court; Supreme Court jurisdiction, decisions, and reform (1965-69); 1968 draft of remarks concerning the court; Warren Jefferson Davis, <u>Judicial Tyranny and the Warren Court</u> (1968).
2642	Surplus Commodities (1955-57). Distribution of surplus foods in Illinois; surplus corn export (1957).
2643-2644	Symington, Stuart (1960). Excerpts from Symington's testimony on defense appropriations (1948-50); addresses and <u>Congressional Record</u> statements by Symington in 1960 regarding the election, security and peace, the economy, the farm program, and the "missile gap."
2645-2646	Taft, Robert (1952, 1957, 1959). Correspondence regarding Taft's candidacy for President; copy of a Taft letter to Dirksen (August 6, 1952) concerning Eisenhower's request to meet with Taft, including a list of conditions Taft required before agreeing to meet; excerpts from Taft's voting record, 80th-83rd Congress; program for dedication of the Taft Memorial (1959).
2647-2653	Tax File (1951-57). Correspondence, pamphlets, clippings, <u>Congressional Record</u> excerpts, and reference information about the following: 1951 withholding tax and patronage dividend deductions; 1952 excess profits tax reform; excise taxes; individual income tax; taxation of cooperatives; legislation to extend the \$20 tax credit, including Dirksen's notes.

2655	Television (n.d.). Termini Production's promotional literature, "Television in Politics."
2656-2658	Tennessee Gas Transmission Company (1956-57). Correspondence, maps, clippings, and memoranda regarding distribution of natural gas from Canada via pipeline and competition for transmission rights among various utilities and pipeline companies.
2659-2675	Tennessee Valley Authority (1951-59). Report of the Electric Consumer Conference (1952); unsuccessful effort to move T.V.A. headquarters to Alabama (1953); T.V.A. funding, performance, and authority; legislation to authorize T.V.A.'s undertaking financing activities, to regulate rates, and to require payments from T.V.A.; draft of Dirksen remarks on T.V.A. self-financing (1959); Dirksen's handwritten notes on 1959 legislation.
2676-2682	Tideland Oil Deposits (1951-53). Clippings, <u>Congressional Record</u> excerpts, and pamphlets regarding the controversy over federal versus state ownership of off-shore mineral deposits and submerged lands, attempts by Harry Truman to seize coastal lands by proclaiming them as a naval oil reserve; 1953 Submerged Lands Act.
2683-2684	Tieken, Robert (1958-59, 1961). Information concerning Tieken's reappointment as U.S. Attorney for the Northern District of Illinois (1959); draft of Tieken's letter to Eisenhower refuting charges of conflict of interest; possible appointment to the federal bench.
2685	<u>Tinker v. Des Moines Independent School District</u> (1969). Supreme Court decision upholding the right of students to stage protests in public schools and to demonstrate in favor of their political beliefs.
2686	Tire Safety Act of 1966 (1966).
2687	Tito (1956). <u>Congressional Record</u> excerpt in which Dirksen speaks about foreign aid to Yugoslavia.
2688	Tobacco (1959). Legislation to stabilize and protect tobacco price supports. Dirksen typed draft of press release.
2689-2825	Trading With the Enemy Subcommittee (1951-64, 1966-67). Information relating to the U.S. government's confiscation of foreign-owned property and resulting war claims. Dirksen served on the Subcommittee and chaired it in 1953 and 1954. Files include correspondence; clippings; Congressional bills, reports, and hearings; <u>Congressional Record</u> excerpts; drafts of legislation and committee reports; hand-written Dirksen notes. Subcommittee operations, staffing, budgeting, and progress reports are documented. Topics considered by the Subcommittee: operation of the Office of Alien Property, the War Claims Commission, and the Foreign Claims Settlement Commission; legislation and administrative actions

2689-2825 (cont.)	affecting the Trading With the Enemy Act and the War Claims Act of 1948; administrative law of enemy property in foreign countries; damage claims; Philippine war claims. The Subcommittee was active in the effort to remove the General Aniline and Film Corporation from government control and to place it under private ownership. Included also are petitions received in 1967 from American ex-prisoners of war asking for compensation for imprisonment. Dirksen introduced bills (1) to set up a commission to administer the return of property of alien countries to the nationals of former enemy countries and (2) to force the U.S. to return enemy assets seized in World War II to private concerns. Major correspondents: State and Justice Departments, Office of Alien Property, Judiciary Committee members and staff, legal counsel to claimants.
2826	Trading With the Enemy Act Subcommittee. Silesian-American Corporation (n.d.). Information about property seized by the Office of Alien Property and the resulting suit filed in federal court.
2827	Traffic Safety Act of 1966 (1966).
2828-2829	Transportation (1957, 1966). Transportation Act of 1957; Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association's position regarding establishment of a Transportation Department.
2830	Treaties (1952, 1956, 1968-69). S.J. Res. 122 (1952) to impose limitations with regard to Executive agreements; Foreign Relations Committee reports concerning the Treaty on the Nonproliferation of Nuclear Weapons (1968-69).
2831	Truth in Lending Act (1965-66). Copy of bill; 1966 address by Lyndon Johnson about consumer interests.
2832	Twining, Lt. General M.B. (1959). Memoranda regarding Twining's appointment as Commandant of the Marine Corps.
2833	Ukrainians (1959-60). Remarks on behalf of Ukrainians and miscellaneous information.
2834	Uniform Relocation Assistance and Land Acquisition Policies Act of 1969 (1969).
2835	Uniformed Services Retirement Pay Equalization Act (1967-68).
